PER CURIAM.

We affirm the trial court's determination that M.H.-R. was guilty of resisting a law enforcement officer without violence. *See Hiibel v. Sixth Judicial Dist. Court of Nevada, Humboldt County*, 542 U.S. 177 (2004) (individual may be required to provide his or her name to law enforcement officer where officer has initiated a valid *Terry*<sup>1</sup> stop). However, we remand for a new disposition hearing (assuming the issue has not

become moot) because of the inconsistencies between the trial court's oral pronouncement and its written order as to the length of M.H.-R.'s curfew and probationary periods.

AFFIRMED in part; REVERSED in part; REMANDED
