ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

Upon review of the record, it appears that: (1) the judgment entered on October 28, 1999 is a judgment only on the plaintiff's claim against the defendants; (2) the October 28, 1999 judgment is certified under HRCP 54(b), but certification under HRCP 54(b) is inappropriate inasmuch as the defendants' counterclaim was dismissed and all claims in Civil No. 97-2069 have been resolved; see HRCP 54(b); (3) a final judgment resolving the complaint and the counterclaim has not been entered pursuant to HRCP 58; and, thus, (4) the appeal of the October 28,

1999 judgment is premature. <u>See Jenkins v. Cades Schutte Fleming</u>
& Wright, 76 Hawai'i 115, 869 P.2d 1334 (1994). Therefore,

 $\,$  IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this appeal is dismissed for lack of appellate jurisdiction.
